

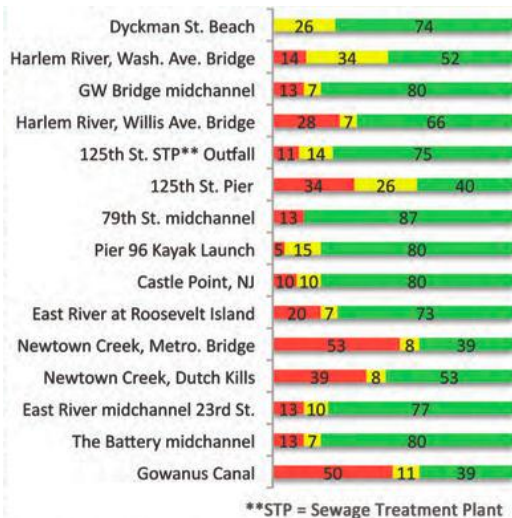
# How's the Water? How's Newtown Creek?
