

AN ACT making appropriations for the support of government (Part A); making appropriations for the support of government (Part B); making appropriations for the support of government (Part C); making appropriations for the support of government (Part D)

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. This act enacts into law major components of legislation
2 which are necessary to implement the state fiscal plan for the 2017-2018
3 state fiscal year. Each component is wholly contained within a Part
4 identified as Parts A through D. The effective date for each particular
5 provision contained within such Part is set forth in the last section of
6 such Part. Any provision in any section contained within a Part,
7 including the effective date of the Part, which makes a reference to a
8 section "of this act", when used in connection with that particular
9 component, shall be deemed to mean and refer to the corresponding
10 section of the Part in which it is found. Section three of this act sets
11 forth the general effective date of this act.

15 STATE OPERATIONS BUDGET

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17 Section 1. a) The several amounts specified in this chapter for state
18 operations, or so much thereof as shall be sufficient to accomplish the
19 purposes designated by the appropriations, are hereby appropriated and
20 authorized to be paid as hereinafter provided, to the respective public
21 officers and for the several purposes specified.

22 b) Where applicable, appropriations made by this chapter for
23 expenditures from federal grants for state operations may be allocated
24 for spending from federal grants for any grant period beginning, during,
25 or prior to, the state fiscal year beginning on April 1, 2017.
