RE: Support an environmental bond act in the SFY 2020-21 New York State budget

Dear Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, Majority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins, and Speaker Carl Heastie,

We write to express our strong support for an environmental bond act. The undersigned 122 organizations represent a diverse cross-section of New Yorkers. Your proposed Bond Act to fund natural resource and habitat restoration, water quality improvements, farmland protection, urban heat island mitigation, flood buyouts, green infrastructure and climate preparedness marks a new chapter in New York's environmental leadership. We strongly support an environmental bond act because investments made today will yield benefits to communities and nature throughout New York, while protecting our quality of life for future generations.

All across the state, flooding and weather-related damages have reached a crisis point with billions of dollars in damages and countless human tragedies. Climate change demands that we take steps immediately to prepare our communities for a future that will bring more water, more heat, and a need to conserve natural resources that we depend on for clean water and natural buffers to extreme weather.

The Environmental Bond Act presents a once in a generation opportunity to directly address the current impacts of climate change and prepare for challenges to come. According to NYSERDA, New York is estimated to face damages related to climate change upwards of \$10 billion annually, although this figure is likely much higher given our current emissions of greenhouse

gasses. According to the Department of Environmental Conservation, heavy rain events have increased by 70 percent between 1958 and 2010. Investments in natural resources that can reduce flood risk will ensure that New York is proactively preparing for the impacts of climate change. And, projects supported by a new bond act will support local jobs from a wide range of professions.

The last environmental bond act, approved over 20 years ago by voters in 1996, continues to provide benefits to New Yorkers and visitors who support the state's robust tourism economy. We strongly believe an environmental bond act should be included in the budget and adopted by April 1st, for inclusion on the November ballot to ensure voters have a chance to weigh in on this vital proposal to restore and protect New York's communities, environment, wildlife, and tourism economy for years to come.
